PARKING AND SAFETY – We know that it can get busy outside school, and we appreciate the logistics of getting small children to school, however, we are aware that there was a near miss outside school at drop off last week due to lack of vigilance. Firstly, we just wanted to remind you that the yellow zig zag lines at the school gate are there to keep the children safe and that it is illegal to park on them at any time. Parking on the yellow zig zag lines forces pedestrians out into the road and obscures walking children from the view of oncoming traffic. Secondly, we would ask that those parents who park near to the school gate are continually mindful that cars pull up to stop and drop the children and that they should not be 'under

cutting' parents who do this. Please wait for the children to be safely in the school gates before pulling away. Some parents may not be aware that we have a 'walk to school path' which can be found to the far side of the staff carpark. Please use this path to avoid the children walking between the parked cars near to the school gate. Finally, we continually ask that parents do not walk through the staff car park. This is potentially extremely dangerous for the children and the drivers. We never think an accident will happenuntil it does!

THE GREAT CORONATION BAKE OFF – On Friday 5th May we will be marking the occasion of the coronation of King Charles with 'The Great Coronation Bake off'. We hope that as many children as possible will bake a coronation cake (or small cup-cakes) which will be cut up and served as part of a children's afternoon tea party. Any cakes that are left over will be sold at the end of the school day for you to enjoy at your own coronation day celebrations. NO NUTS OR PEANUT BUTTER PLEASE. In addition, a small group of children will be joining the Village Care group on Tuesday 2nd May at the Community Centre to learn more about the coronation of 1953. Thank you to the Village Care Committee for suggesting such a community minded activity for the children.

THE WORLD CHOIR PROJECT – We are delighted to have been offered the opportunity to take part in the World Choir Project at the Theatre Royal in Norwich on May 24th. We will be taking 16 children who always contribute as role models in our singing assemblies. Letters will be going out to the children involved after the holidays.

FOREST SCHOOL – CLASS 4 WILL BE STARTING FOREST SCHOOL ON TUESDAYS AFTER EASTER. Please make sure that the children have appropriate clothing for their Forest School sessions this half term. Children need boots or sturdy shoes and gloves and hats, or sunhats as the weather improves. The children cannot wear sandals or Crocs for Forest School. C3 will have their sessions after the May half term and C5 will have some individual Forest School sessions through the Summer. Parents will be informed of these dates.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL - If your child is absent from school, please call the office number 01263 761264 at the earliest opportunity and leave a message. Please call each day of your child's absence, giving your child's name and reason. Please do not email, although we appreciate it can be easier for you to quickly do this, we cannot guarantee that the email has been received and therefore your child would be registered as 'Missing in Education', which then prompts Safeguarding measures to be taken.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB – We are delighted to welcome Brodie Clarke to our After School Club team. Brodie will be with us on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings. The team are already enjoying the extra energy he brings to outdoor time in the sunny evenings!

SCHOOL WEBSITE – We are continually updating our school website to include information about the children's learning in each term and in each class. Please do familiarise yourself with the website as it provides lots of information about the curriculum.

SCHOOL OUTFITS – Please could all parents and carers be aware of some of the logos and brand names that are on the t-shirts and jumpers that the children wear for school. We would prefer the children not to have logos or brand names on their clothes please. Items of clothing that are acceptable outside school are not necessarily acceptable in school.

EATON VALE TRIP – Thank you to all of the parents and carers of year 5 children who have paid towards the Eaton Vale trip in October. Please could we remind those who haven't yet paid that the second instalment of £110 is due before we return to school after Easter.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL – Parents and carers are reminded that any medicine that comes to school must be handed in to the school office and the appropriate paper work must be completed. Please ensure that all prescription medication is in the original pharmacy container/packaging, which includes the child's name and the necessary dosage/instructions. If prescription medicines do not have this information then school staff are unable to administer the medication.

AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIY CLUBS – We are delighted that so many of you took part in our activity clubs this half term. There will not be any clubs after Easter, but we hope to start again after the May half term. Watch this space!

SWIMMING – Year 3 will continue their swimming sessions on Mondays after the Easter holidays. Please ensure that the children have their full swimming kit including a swimming hat with them. Children should not wear earrings on swimming days.

TRANSITION DAYS – Now that the year 6 children have been allocated their school places for September some of the secondary schools have given us the dates for their transition days. The year 6 children who have been allocated places at Aylsham High School will visit on Wed 28th June, Thurs 29th June and Friday 30th June. The year 6 children who have allocated places at Sheringham High School will visit on Tuesday 4th July and Wednesday 5th July. **PLEASE AVOID BOOKING ANY DAYS OFF SCHOOL AT THIS IMPORTANT TIME.** The secondary schools will be in touch with parents/carers directly with further information. **OUR WHOLE SCHOOL TRANSITION DAY WILL BE ON THURSDAY 29TH JUNE.**

PE KIT - A gentle reminder that all children need their PE kit in school at all times. It should not be taken home at the end of the week. PE kit is a white T-shirt, black or navy shorts and black or navy track suit bottoms/leggings and trainers. The children should wear a sweat shirt for outdoor PE. As always, the health and well-being of the children is our number one priority. Please ensure that the children have their PE kit in school with them at all times.

HEALTHY SNACKS, LUNCHES AND BIRTHDAY TREATS – Please ensure that the snacks and packed lunches that the children bring to school are healthy and nut free. We work very hard as a school to support health and well-being and the contents of some lunch boxes make consistent messages difficult for the children to understand. It would be much appreciated if birthday treats, which are shared with the class, are also sugar free and consistent with

children's health and well-being. Please avoid sugary lollipops in particular. Thank you for your continued support in this matter. If your child is in KS2 and has a school snack, please pay in the school shop in Pupil Asset.
